Here are few points shared by the participants:

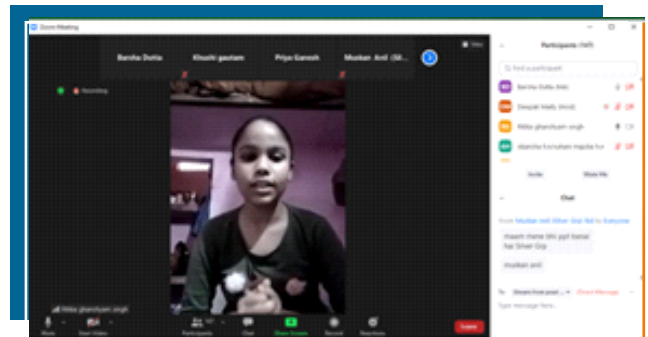
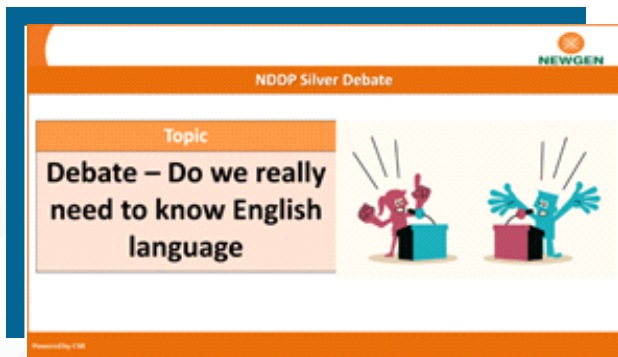
“If we know English, we get the confidence to interact with people. It is the language of international communication.” - Roli, expressed for the motion
